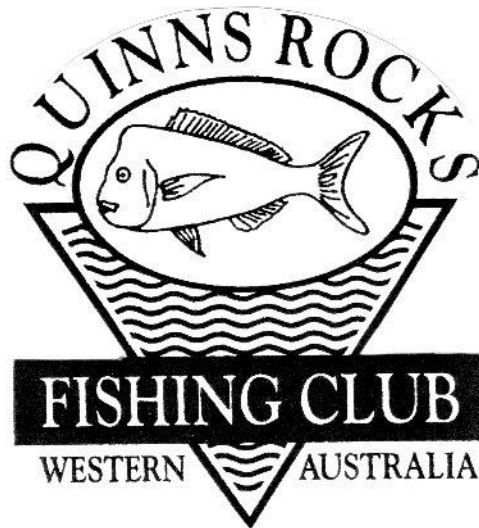

MONTHLY COMPETITION RULES 2023/2024

NOTE: Shaded Areas are new rules to 2023-24

1. Fishing competitions will be held on the 3rd Sunday of each month (4th Sunday as stand-by- except for April, Sept and October), with exception to December when it will be held on 2nd Sunday and the stand-by on the 3rd Sunday.
2. Competition: **Sign-on** – October to March: between Sat 4:00 p.m. & Sun 6:00 a.m.
Start time – BEACH. Saturday 5:00 p.m. BOAT. Sunday 6:00 a.m.
Sign-on - April to September: between Sat 4.00 p.m. & Sun 7:00 am.
Start time – BEACH. Saturday 4:00 p.m. BOAT. Sunday 7:00 a.m.
Finish/Weigh-in - All bags must be in the weigh-in area no later than 4.00 p.m. when the weigh-in will commence.
3. COMPETITION FEES: Adult's \$5.00, Junior's \$2.50 (under 16 as of July 1st),
Visitors - No charge.
Fees must be paid by the weigh-in time to be part of the competition.
4. All competitors (including Beach Anglers) must register by **TEXT message** or at the Mindarie ramp prior to start time to the ***Club Captain*** (or the ***Competition Officer***) ***with competing anglers name(s) included.*** Can only fish Beach or Boat NOT BOTH.
5. **A. There must be a minimum of 3 boats entering in any one competition within 30 minutes of starting time,** otherwise that competition will be postponed till the stand-by date by the Captain or Angling & Sports member(s) running the competition, even if some boats have already left the boat ramp(s).
B. A competition will automatically be called off when there is a STRONG WIND WARNING forecast between 4:00 a.m. (the B.O.M's inshore forecast) and midnight
C. If due to inclement weather or other necessitating circumstances, a competition may be cancelled within 2 hours of the start time at the discretion of the Captain or Angling & Sports committee member(s) after notifying all other competitors.
D. It is the responsibility of the skipper of each participating vessel to make themselves aware of the current weather forecast and sea conditions before putting to sea.
6. There will be 3 (Three) competition divisions, Men's, Ladies and Juniors (Juniors under the age of 16 at July 1st at the Start of the fishing year).
7. **VISITORS** may enter 3 competitions only. Do not qualify for any of the monthly prizes but accrue points towards the annual competition when joining the QRFC. The points will be added to the Anglers overall points for the fishing year.
8. There are 5 (Five) Trophy divisions; **A.** Club Champion (Overall), **B.** Men's, **C.** Ladies, **D.** Juniors, **E.** The biggest of each of the species as listed by the Angling & Sports Committee. (Biggest fish species will include Men's, Ladies, Junior's).
9. **Weighable species:**

- A. Only 1 (one) of each species as listed in the A&S list with in the Fisheries Dept. possession limits.
- B. Anglers to refer to the A&S list of eligible species for weighable species, category and minimum sizes for competition days.

10. REASONS FOR DISQUALIFICATIONS.

- **A. More than 1 fish of any species as listed in the Angling & Sports program and as per Fisheries possession limit.
- **B. A mutilated fish is not eligible for weighing-in (a mutilated fish is by means of piece(s) missing from Shark bites or similar, damaged by boat propeller etc.) (this does not include gilled and gutted or cut for bleeding).
- **C. Fish that have their neck broken will be pushed back into original shape and must be 1 cm longer than listed minimum size. This does not apply to gilled and gutted fish or with the throat cut for bleeding.
- **D. Undersized fish as per A&S species list. (A just size fish can shrink about 25mm, so remember to re-check your catch prior to entering the weigh-in area).
- **E. Fish presented for weighing-in **MUST BE** in an **INOFFENSIVE STATE**. Fish in rotten, badly deteriorated or generally unfit for consumption are considered offensive. The weigh-in officer has the right to disqualify the catch in its entirety.
- **F. Each competitor must present their fish in individual wet cloth or hessian bags for weighing-in. (Plastic bags of any form are deemed **NOT SUITABLE** with the exception of Squid to prevent inking but must be kept cool).
Bags must be clearly labeled with anglers name.
- **G. Squid are to be presented in a A&S provided light gauge plastic bag so all bags can be weighed without prejudice. Squid in A&S plastic bags are also to be kept with the rest of the catch in cool wet cloth or hessian bag.
- **H. Squid/Fish must be caught by means of a hook or Jig before landing.
- **I. **Power assisted** winches or rods and reels, Set-lines, drop lines, traps or hooks on markers/floats used for finfish fishing are not permitted on any boats.
This will lead to the disqualification of all the anglers on that boat.
- **J. Angler must **NOT** use a combination of more than two (2) rods/reels/hand lines For other than demersal fish. Each rod or hand line must not have more than two (2) hooks (a gang of hooks, flight or Snell of hooks to be considered as one hook). Demersal only 1 hook (gang, flight or lure/jig) Max 2 lines as above.
This will lead to the disqualification of all the anglers on that boat.
- **K. Anglers must hook and land their own catch, but may receive assistance with gaffing, netting, gilling or holding the leader where it does not include controlling a rod and reel or main line when retrieving a fish.

11 PHOTO WEIGH-IN PRESENTATION:

- **A. Only 1 of each eligible species as specified in the Angling & Sports program may be photographed and not exceed Fisheries daily bag limit.
- ** B. Photos are to be taken with The photo showing the date and time on the day with the fish shown clearly on a measuring board/mat.
- **C. Fish in an Offensive state or Mutilated, are not eligible for any competitions.

- ** D. Photo to be taken on an appropriate Fisheries measurer or Brag mat showing all Measurement's clearly.
- ** E. Photos of fish are to be viewed by the recorder at the weigh-in.
- ** F. A photographed fish is worth 10 points only with exception to 10 bonus points for Fish of the Day & rule 11 **G. and 2 points for second largest if 2 fish presented even if photographed fish looks larger.
- ** G. If only 1 (one) of a species is submitted on the day, it will be awarded 10 points as the heaviest of that species.
- ** H. Anglers must be present at the weigh-in for photographed fish to be eligible.

12 POINT SYSTEM AS FOLLOWS.

- A. QRFC monthly competitions are species based.
- B. **Division** winner(s) will be determined by the angler with the most points on the day. In the event of a draw, anglers will be separated firstly by most species followed by weight if still a draw.
- C. Club records caught on club competition days accrue 10 bonus points. Anglers have 7 days to apply for a club record but DO NOT receive 10 points if not presented on the day. Fish for club records that are not on the Angling & Sports species list must be presented prior to the start of the weigh-in (NOT PROTECTED SPECIES) Any member can weigh in a Club Record in any competition event where the club is participating and/or any social or otherwise event supported by the club (Any fish species eligible). (No bonus points added to monthly competition scores)

****It is the duty of the competitor(s) to notify the weigh master of a possible Club Record(s) to be weighed separately.**

- D. **Club competitions will be species competitions and points run as follows:**
 - 10 points for each species caught as per QRFC Angling & Sports species list (be aware of Fisheries possession sizes and limits).
 - 10 points will be awarded to each angler entered in the monthly fishing competition.
 - 10 points for the heaviest and 2 points for the second heaviest of each species incl. FOD.
 - 10 points awarded to each angler who catches the nominated Fish of the Day species.
 - 10 points for any club record submitted on the competition day.
- E. Prizes for the section winners of Men's, Ladies and Juniors Divisions along with other selected categories will be presented on the Friday night after the competition day. (Category winners must be present at the club to claim any species prizes with the exception of FIFO or shift workers while away/working).
- F. Anglers must weigh-in an eligible species to be eligible for any Divisional prizes.
- G. At the end of the fishing calendar year (June), Anglers best nine (9) scores will be their total points for the fishing season.

- 13. Release weights are compulsory when fishing for demersal fish.
- 14. Cleaning any fish near the launching ramps or around the weigh-in area is not permitted unless collecting fish frames.
- 15. Safety equipment must be carried by law as per Navigable Waters regulations.
- 16. In the event of a breakdown, disabled boat and boat rendering assistance may still weigh-in their catch.

17. ****Marine Radio:** All boats fishing in QRFC competition's, must be fitted with a good and proper working order Marine Radio of VHF.

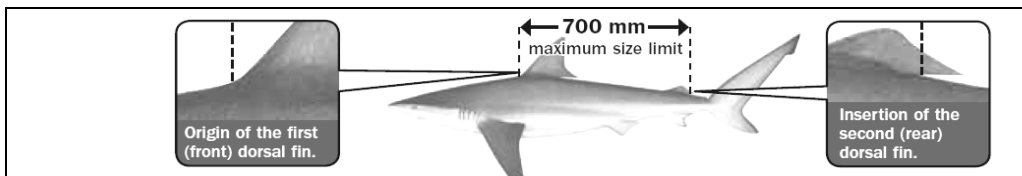
Failure to do so may cause complications and will eliminate the boat from the comp.

How to correctly measure a fish

(FRMR Regulation 151, Schedule 8)

Fish should be measured in a 'natural' position, i.e. tail not distorted (the tail should be laid flat and mouth closed)
Most finfish are measured from the point of the snout to the tip of the tail.

Sat. 4th – Sun. 5th November 2023

1. *Competition Times:*

- A. Start: Saturday 12.00 p.m. Sign-on: 12:00 pm – 6:00 pm by Text Club Captain.
- B. Finished: Sunday morning in time for bags in weigh-in area by 12:00 p.m.
- C. Weigh-in: Sunday, Quinn's Beach near surf club. 12:00 p.m.

- 2. Entry fee; \$5.00 adult, \$2.50 Juniors. (Free Sausage Sizzle).
- 3. The club Captain, Safety Officer or the Angling & Sports member running the competition has the right to cancel the competition in the event of bad weather.
- 4. Competition is open to any immediate family, friend(s) of members fishing as single Competitor's.
- 5. Boundaries: There are No boundaries but land based fishing only permitted.
- 6. There will be 3 (Three) competition divisions, Men's, Ladies and Juniors (Juniors under the age of 16 at July 1st at the Start of the fishing year).
- 7. **VISITORS** may enter the competitions. Do Not qualify for any of the monthly prizes but accrue points towards the annual competition when joining the QRFC. The points will be added to the Anglers overall points for the fishing year.

8. Weighable species:

- A. Only 1 (one) of each species as listed in the A&S list with in the Fisheries Dept. possession limits.
- B. Anglers to refer to the A&S list of eligible species for weighable species, category and minimum sizes for competition days.

9. REASONS FOR DISQUALIFICATIONS.

- **A. More than 1 fish of any species as listed in the Angling & Sports program and as per Fisheries possession limit.
- **B. A mutilated fish is not eligible for weighing-in (a mutilated fish is by means of piece(s) missing from Shark bites or similar etc.) (this does not include gilled and gutted or cut for bleeding)
- **C. Fish that have their neck broken will be pushed back into original shape and must be 1 cm longer than listed minimum size. This does not apply to gilled and gutted fish or with the throat cut for bleeding.
- **D. Undersized fish as per A&S species list.
- **E. Fish presented for weighing-in **MUST BE** in an INOFFENSIVE STATE. Fish in rotten, badly deteriorated or generally unfit for consumption are considered offensive. The weigh-in officer has the right to disqualify the catch in its entirety.
- **F. Each competitor must present their fish in a wet cloth or hessian bag for weighing-in. (Plastic type)

bags of any form are deemed NOT SUITABLE with the exception of Squid to prevent inking). Bags must be clearly labeled with each angler's name.

- **G. Squid are to be presented in a A&S provided light gauge plastic bag so all bags can be weighed without prejudice. Squid in A&S plastic bags are also to be kept with the rest of the catch in cool wet cloth or hessian bag.
- **H. Squid/Fish must be caught by means of a hook or Jig before landing.
- **I. Angler must not use a combination of more than two (2) rods/reels or hand lines at any one time. Each rod or hand line must not have more than two (2) hooks (a gang of hooks, flight or Snell of hooks to be considered as one hook).
- **J. Anglers must hook and land their own catch, but may receive assistance with gaffing, netting, gilling or holding the leader where it does not include controlling the rod and reel or main line when retrieving a fish.

11. POINT SYSTEM AS FOLLOWS.

- A. QRFC beach competition are species based and points added to the yearly tally.
- B. Division winner(s) will be determined by the angler with the most points on the day. In the event of a draw, anglers will be separated firstly by most species followed by weight if still a draw.
- C. Club records caught on club competition days accrue 10 bonus points. Fish for club records that are not on the Angling & Sports species list must be presented prior to the start of the weigh-in. Any member can weigh in a Club Record in any competition event where the club is participating and/or any social or otherwise event supported by the club (Any fish species eligible). (No bonus points added to monthly competition scores)
****It is the duty of the competitor(s) to notify the weigh master of a possible Club Record(s) to be weighed separately.**

****Club competitions will be species competitions and points run as follows:**

- 10 points for each species caught as per QRFC Angling & Sports species list (be aware of Fisheries possession sizes and limits).
 - 10 points will be awarded to each angler entered in the monthly fishing competition.
 - 10 points for the heaviest and 2 points for the second heaviest of each species.
 - 10 points awarded to each angler who catches the nominated Fish of the Day species.
 - 10 points for any club record on the competition day.
 - D: Prizes for the winners of Men's, Ladies and Juniors Divisions along with selected. Categories will be presented on the Friday night after the competition day. (Category winners must be present at the club to claim any prizes with the exception of FIFO and shift workers while away/working).
 - E. Anglers must weigh-in an eligible species to be eligible for any Division prizes.
12. Any member can weigh in a Club Record in any competition or event where the club is participating and/or any social or otherwise event supported by the club. (Any fish species eligible). (No bonus points).
13. Cleaning any fish near the launching ramps or around the weigh-in area is not permitted unless collecting fish frames.
